Over the past year at Cardinal Cushing Centers we have made great strides towards our vision for the future: creating a community where people of all ages from all walks of life, with and without disabilities, live, learn, work and socialize in the same space. We have been able to make these strides while simultaneously enhancing our current programs and services and maintaining our fiscal

health. We hope you enjoy reading this year's annual report to learn more about our good work.

In 1947 the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi, under the guidance of Richard Cardinal Cushing, created a safe, educational place where students and adults with intellectual disabilities could truly thrive. We have worked to take this environment and bring the outside in, welcome the community around us to enjoy our resources, meet our students and adults, and interact with us in new and exciting ways that benefit all parties involved. And while we always look ahead towards the future, making active progress towards our ultimate goals, we respect our history and our roots, and to this day are grateful for the guidance and leadership of the Sisters.

We are taking the necessary steps to turn the centerpiece of our vision for the Hanover campus into a reality: the long-term lease of the Kennedy Building. In partnership with the Planning Office of Urban Affairs, this building will be transformed into 37 units of workforce housing with four units set aside for people with disabilities. We look forward to welcoming new residents to enjoy a cup of coffee in our Bass Café or to attend a future movie night with our students and adults.

A little further to the North on our Braintree campus we have started to expand our community, laying the groundwork for a new partnership with the Meeting House Montessori School, who will share space with the St. Coletta Day School students and staff in the coming fiscal year. We have much to learn from each other.

Our fiscal health coupled with the support and generosity of our donors allowed us to make some important enhancements to our buildings and our programs over the past year, including repairs and upgrades to the Leonard Florence Education Center, the purchase of smart board technology for our classrooms, hiring new professional staff to fill key roles, as well as the installation of a brand new fitness center in Hanover.

With your continued support we will continue our efforts to maintain our position as one of the premiere service providers for individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families as we expand our community and welcome others into our world.

So much so, Wood has named Cardinal Cushing Centers as a beneficiary in his will. "I never had any children and got married for the first time last year," said Wood. "I wanted to give back to the school that raised me."

"As I read what Cushing has been doing in recent years, I see a vast improvement in equipping students for a place in the world. I see now the school preparing students in a variety of ways, from job training, residential living options, social skills and involvement in the community. I am glad to see a college option as well."

"What makes me happiest is being able to give back to others. I am happy for the understanding I now have of the struggles I had as a child and adult. I hope I can be a mentor and inspiration to others."

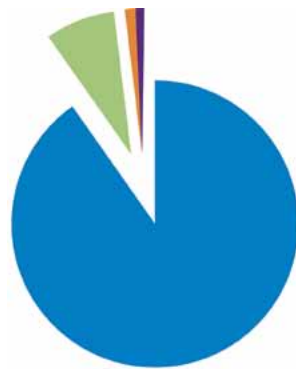
our year in review

Here's what we've been up to:

- Formalized plans to partner with the Meeting House Montessori School, who will share space with the St. Coletta Day School in the coming fiscal year
- Installed a brand new fitness center in Hanover, made possible by support from the Boston Bruins Foundation and Covidien CARES
- Relocated two of our adult programs, South Shore Industries (SSI) and Life Opportunities Unlimited (LOU) North to more modern space.
- Filled the role of Assistive Technology Specialist, an important addition to our staff as the technology needs of the people we support continue to grow
- Renovated parts of our campus in need of repair and remodeling including the pillars outside of the main building on our Hanover Campus, the Leonard Florence Education Center, as well as our reception area, Marion Hall and a new classroom within our Bottle Redemption Center
 - Hired a part-time dietitian to work with our students and staff on health, wellness and good nutrition
 - Updated the Sensory Therapy Room on our Hanover Campus
 - The Planned Giving Advisory Committee, formed only last year, saw results, recognizing success in the form of planned gifts as well as an increase in our network of donors and business supporters
 - Expanded our after-school enrichment program from two to five days/week
- Sent 21 students on a trip of a lifetime to Disney World thanks to South Shore Bank's annual St. Pat's dinner and auction fundraiser
- Installed new technology in our classrooms including smartboards, Chrome Books, and a new software program, Clicker 6, made possible by funds from the Eastern Bank Foundation
- Adult Services opened two new homes on the Hanover campus and refurbished another out in the community

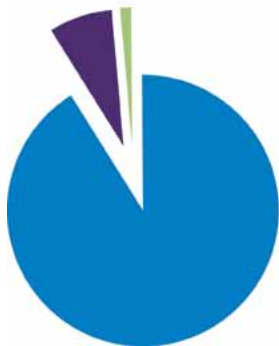


statement of financial position JUNE 2014
