Other July Activities/News

Clubs: We are continuing to offer afternoon clubs. We'll keep doing the Art Club and Crafts Club and doubling their frequency to twice a month each, but are dropping the Photography Club due to lack of interest (if you have anyone who is interested, please reach out and we can schedule a time). I'd love to start the Grilling Club if people are interested. The Large Sun Conference Room in Fatima (the new Adult Services offices on "The Hill") has worked well to accommodate our groups so we'll continue to use it when it's available.

1. Photography Club (tentatively canceled): The Rec Hall is letting us use 4-5 of their digital cameras, but people are welcome to bring their own. The idea is to start with the basics by taking pictures around campus and then start moving outward to local areas of interest/historical significance and beauty. Pictures will then be shared and discussed with the possibility of displaying them in a show.
2. Crafts Club: Based on the success of our Jewelry Making Class, we'll meet twice a month to work on various craft activities and plan our projects around who is interested. For our first meeting, we tried weaving, but most people were more interested in coloring and socializing (which was a lot of fun!)
3. Art Club: So far people have been most interested in coloring mandalas/coloring pages and just socializing as a group. We completed our first project, a multimedia tree with maple leaves and birds.



4. Grilling Club: Location/Date/Time TBA. We're hoping to use some of the vegetables and herbs grown in our house gardens to come together in small groups to learn how to BBQ and create healthy summer meals.
5. Walking & Hiking Club: Due to lack of RSVPs for weekends, we'll move potential walks to Wednesdays. Please RSVP if interested, and we'll plan our destinations accordingly.

6. Gardens: 7 of our 15 houses now have gardens/planters/raised beds. Vegetables, herbs, and flowers were available to our houses for free from the Greenhouse/Garden Center on campus. In June, Washington Street was generously given a large raised bed/planter by Dylan O'Brien as part of his Eagle Scout project. Wednesday, July 8th, there was a small ceremony at Washington Street where a plaque was placed on the planter, followed by a BBQ at the O'Brien's house in Hanover. If your house would like to participate in growing a garden next year please reach out and we can start the planning.

Cedar Hill: Our second and final stay of 2026 at Cedar Hill Retreat Center (Duxbury) starts Thursday, September 3rd and ends Wednesday, September 9th. Scheduling is set to be a topic at the next RSM meeting, so reach out ASAP once the schedule is out and reserve your time!

Pool Parties: We had our first two Pool Parties on Wednesday, June 24th and Monday, July 13th from 5:30-7:00pm. We offered only healthy options with seltzers and bottled water and a free salad bar with two types of grilled chicken. Houses were tasked with bringing their own dinners. We'll continue with this format to make it easier for those individuals we serve who struggle with making healthy choices, as there are ample opportunities elsewhere for burgers, hot dogs, and pizza. If weather permits, we'll hold a third pool party in August.
